IHS GRAD CEREMONY HISTORY & '22 PLAN

- Pre-Covid, I understand most Grad Ceremonies were held in the Large Gym; many complain they were crowded and hot.
- Grad '20 was held on the Football Field a pleasant but austere COVID ceremony with limited attendance, which made setup/security feasible. We were fortunate to have pleasant weather.

- Grad '21 was held in the Large Gym.
