## Hey Juniors, this is for YOU Senior Timeline on College Process

- **Summer** / Early Fall – Narrow Down Colleges of Choice
  - Review Admission Requirements for Undergraduates
    - GPA / required classes / SAT or ACT
  - Admission deadlines / Bonus for early registration
  - Fees – cost for each application – most are non-refundable.
  - Common App or application through college
  - Update and / or create a resume.
  - Have conversations over the summer about financials so that everyone is on the same page when you start applying and looking for colleges.
- **Fall** - Admissions Process Starts

- **Admissions and deadlines**
  - Apply (application through college or Common App) to Universities / Colleges / Trade Schools
- **Letters of Recommendation / Resume / Essays**
  - Start asking teachers for letters of recommendation early, allow for two weeks and provide a bulleted list of accomplishments and examples of your Integrity/Humanity & Scholarship for the teacher to refer to. You are likely not the only one asking for a letter, so be helpful and polite.
  - Essays – write one and then tweak for different requirements. Ms. Hermann’s Boot Camp is highly recommended, see attachment or flyer on 2024 Class Teams page.
  - Resume – update with most current information

- **Late Fall – Winter – Spring – Scholarships**
  - **FASFA (December)**
    - All WCSD High Schools will be holding FASFA nights. Incline’s will be announced in next week’s newsletter.
    - Contact TMCC or UNR Financial Aid for extra help (don’t need to go there to use this service)
  - **Programs connected to FAFSA or Tuition that pay for school:**
    - TMCC NV Promise Scholarship – opens August 1<sup>st</sup> / ends October 31<sup>st</sup>
    - UNR – NV Guarantee (must receive a Pell grant or partial Pell grant)
  - **Scholarships:**
    - Look at the college you will be attending for first year-scholarships
    - IHS Community Scholarships
    - Local vs. National
    - Fast Web / Greenlight - tons of websites out there, just make sure they are legit and do NOT sell your name
    - You can reuse / tweak essays from your college essays (don’t reinvent the wheel)
